NEW – now accepting paint and batteries.

Items NOT accepted are: toxic waste, or propane tanks, or any e-waste such as computers or televisions.

Untidy lots

As per Bylaw #140 properties deemed unsafe and/or untidy by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer may be cleaned by the Village, and the cost then added to that property's tax role.

Organics/Waste Bins

Please note the lids on these bins <u>must be</u> fully closed or they will not be picked up.

IMPORTANT- Be sure to put your bins away as stolen bins will be replaced at a cost of \$100.00/ per bin to the resident.

New bins will not be delivered until payment is made to the Village.

Dangerous trees

Bylaw #140 requires that dead trees (or those posing a hazard) must be cut down by the property owner.

Fire Bans

Be advised that The Summer Village currently follows fire bans as declared by NorthWest Fire Rescue. In the event of a fire ban. Fire Ban signage will be erected (at both entries into the Village) and all Fire Bans will be noted on the Summer Village's website and message board.

Fireworks

Fireworks are NOT allowed with the Summer Village without a permit. Permits are approved by Council and only where a pyrotechnician will be handling the fireworks. Please see Bylaw #290 on the website for more information.
